3. Strengthening Medicaid in Health Reform

There is broad consensus that a newly reformed health system should build on the components of our current system, including Medicaid—the joint federal and state-funded health insurance program for certain low-income parents, children, seniors, and people with disabilities. Medicaid is currently the largest source of health care funding for low-income people in the United States, and nearly 70 percent of the program's adult beneficiaries are women. Our first guest speaker will share recommendations for how, as part of comprehensive health reform, this critical program should be improved and expanded to meet the needs of women and their families.
