Exhibit A

- b. The student's trimester GPA is less than 2.0 in any of three of the first five trimesters of enrollment.
- c. The students has received three Fs, AFs or WFs in the same course (does not have to be consecutive).
- 2. If dismissed, the student may appeal the sanction to the Committee on Reinstatement if he/she believes there were mitigating circumstances. See point 3 below.

The Committee on Reinstatement has the right to approve or deny readmission and to establish individual directives, restrictions and guidelines regarding student reenrollment status. The Committee, upon consultation with the Vice-President of Academic Affairs, may use discretion for students with unique circumstances.

If readmission is denied the student is dismissed from the program. This sanction may be appealed to the Vice-President of Academic Affairs.

- 3. If the student wishes to appeal a dismissal, the appeal must be submitted in writing or electronically to the Committee on Reinstatement through the Office of the Registrar. Supporting documentation of mitigating circumstances must be included with the written appeal. Mitigating circumstances as defined by the U.S. Department of Education (34CFR 668.34) include:
 - a. Serious illness or injury to the student.
 - b. Death of a relative.
 - Other special circumstances.

Attendance Policy

- 1. Regularity and punctuality of class attendance is expected of all students and the record keeping is the responsibility of the instructor. More detailed information concerning attendance may become a part of the syllabus or covered the first day of class.
- 2. Various state agencies and accrediting bodies require Logan to maintain attendance records for all students.
- 3. Students who have completed all required registration activities are listed on class rosters in Self-Service. Instructors use the roster in Self-Service to record class attendance.
- 4. Excessive absences, more than 15% of scheduled classes, constitute the basis for assigning the grade of Attendance Failure (AF) for a course. With proper documentation, a student may be excused from an absence for the following reasons:
 - Military service
 - Jury duty
 - National Licensure Examinations (examination dates only)
 - Off-site Sanctioned Events

All other absences are assigned to the 15% maximum.

- 5. A student awarded a grade of AF for a course is not allowed in the class after that point and cannot take any additional course examination. If a student wishes to contest an AF grade, he/she should follow the procedure outlined in the Grading System-DC and BS Applicable section of the Student Handbook.
- 6. Missing an examination is a serious matter and must be corrected as soon as possible. It is the responsibility of the student to contact the instructor.
- 7. Health Center Interns have a different attendance policy. See the Health Center Handbook for details.

Attendance at Off-site Sanctioned Events

This policy allows Logan College of Chiropractic/University Programs to have excused absences from classes/clinic shifts to attend select off-site Logan events, sanctioned by the Office of Academic Affairs, under the guidance of Logan Employees.

Requests for an off-site Logan event to be sanctioned by the Office of Academic Affairs must be received no less than 30 days prior to the beginning of the event. the request must address the following items:

- The name of the event;
- the purpose (or learning objectives) of the event;
- the dates of the event, inclusive of travel.
- Any required pre-event informational and training sessions for the students.
- The specific activities in which the students will be engaged during the event.
- Any restrictions for the students.
- How students will be provided appropriate time over the duration of the event to address the assignments given to them by each instructor whose courses will be missed.

Requirements

- A student must be in academic and professional good standing.
- A student must have prior approval from each instructor whose class will be missed on the day(s) of the event.
- A student must have prior written approval from the supervising Logan employee (s) to participate in the event.
- A student must participate in all required pre-event informational and training sessions required by the Logan employee(s) supervising the event.
- An instructor is to provide a student with required assignments prior to the scheduled departure for the event. Assignments are to relate to material that will be covered in class during a student's absence and are to be of equivalent intensity to assignments given to the students in the class who are not participating in the event.
- The Logan employees(s) supervising the event are to provide appropriate time over the duration of the event for students to address their required assignments.
- A student is required to complete all assignments given by each instructor for missed classes. Assignments must be submitted to each instructor at the completion of the event within a time-frame equivalent to the event. For example, a student must submit

Hi Dr, Chai,

I hope this finds you well. Thank you for your correspondence. I am a bit confused and will require further clarification in regards to the conflicting communication between you and Dr. Davis as the email I received from you and the email I received from Dr. Davis state opposing views as to the opinion of Dr. Davis in obtaining an incomplete grade in both master's courses.

Your email to me states the following, "I fully support the decision made by Dr. Davis after I spoke with her" (please see the entire email below received from you today). The email I received directly from Dr. Davis on Friday, April 26, 2013 states the exact opposite when she states the following, "I made a request to the department and registrar on your behalf because I know you had qualifying extenuating circumstances" (please see the entire email below received Friday, April 26).

I am confused, as according to Dr. Davis' email correspondence to me on Friday, April 26, it clearly states that the decision to deny the incomplete grades based on her making the "request to the department and registrar on my behalf due to qualifying extenuating circumstances," is your decision and was not her decision and/or her opinion.

I also find it very offensive that you would state that you know what is in my best interest, "It is not in your and our program's best interest to give you "incomplete" on these two courses." Regardless of your opinion on what is in the best interest of the program, your statement that it is not in MY best interest, quite frankly, is not for you to decide. To clarify, it would be the exact opposite. It is not in my best interest to not be able to complete both courses.

I will require complete clarification either in (written communication from you or in a formal meeting with you) in regards to the opposing emails and I will also require complete clarification in (written communication from you or in a formal meeting with you) as to how your decision was made to deny both mine and (according to

Dr. Davis email to me) her request for incomplete grades in MSN5100 and MSN5020 due to my "qualifying extenuating circumstances" as the following under Title IX is my current understanding, according to what has been explained to me by the organization itself when an institution receives federal funding:

Does my school have to excuse my absences due to pregnancy, childbirth or abortion?

Your school must excuse your absences due to pregnancy or any related conditions for as long as your doctor says it is necessary for you to be absent. This is true even if there is no leave policy for students with other conditions. When you return to school, you must be reinstated to the status you held before your leave. The school can require you to submit a doctor's note from you only if that is required of students with other medical conditions.

Does my school have to let me make up the work I missed while I was absent?

Yes, your school must let you make up the work you missed while you were out due to pregnancy or any related conditions, including recovery from childbirth. For example, if you have a doctor's note that excuses you from class for several weeks because you were on "bed rest" before giving birth, your school has to provide you with the appropriate assignments and information to make up all of the work you would have been required to complete while you were out.

But what if my school says that absence/make-up work policies are up to each individual professor?

While that may be the school's practice, the school administration and professors are bound by federal civil rights law. Title IX requires that schools ensure that all faculty and staff comply with the law and do not discriminate against pregnant and parenting students. An individual professor's policy is not okay if it breaks the law.



Dear Dr. Chai:

I am counsel for Brandi Kostal, a current student at Logan College of Chiropractic ("Logan").

As you know, Brandi was not allowed to complete two masters level classes after accommodations were not made for her to make up work missed due to her pregnancy, delivery and post-delivery medical complications.

Logan's actions violate Title IX - the federal law that prohibits sex discrimination in education.

An almost identical situation was recently resolved at the City University of New York ("CUNY") which refused to allow a pregnant student to make up tests or assignments which were not completed on time due to pregnancy related absences, including labor and delivery. The student filed a complaint with the United States Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights. Last week CUNY agreed to settle that complaint by, among other things, (1) allowing the affected student to complete the courses; (2) reimbursing her for expenses; and (3) adopting a new university wide policy addressing the rights of pregnant and parenting students under Title IX, conduct training on Title IX for its faculty, and including the policy in its student handbook.

At this point, it is still possible to rectify the situation by correcting Brandi's academic record and allowing her an extension of time to complete her coursework prior to the start of the next term.

Since this matter must be resolved promptly in order for Brandi to be able to complete her coursework this term, I request that you arrange for the proper person to contact Brandi by noon on Wednesday, May 8, 2013 to make the necessary arrangements for her to complete the coursework.

RE: In the matter of Brandi Kostal - proposed resolution, no admission of liability

Dear Ms. Hasler,

Logan disputes the facts as you have written. Logan was well aware of Ms. Kostal's upcoming "at-risk" delivery and advised her to take a lighter course load before the trimester began. She refused. Weeks after the delivery and her return to classes, Ms. Kostal brought to Student Services a note from her physician stating she should not have returned and was not cleared to return to classes. Instead of following her doctor's instructions she asked Logan to ignore the letter and allow her to continue her coursework as enrolled. Indeed, Ms. Kostal indicated to Logan's Student Services that she did not want any accommodations to her coursework due to her pregnancy, delivery and recovery. She refused accommodations to withdraw her from her courses without penalty based on absences.

Even with her delivery and recovery, Ms. Kostal successfully completed eight courses (25 credits). She also worked with instructors of another five courses to allow her to complete coursework during the period allowed for incompletes.

As far as the two on-line courses which she failed – at some point Ms. Kostal stopped participating. She stopped communicating to her instructor and stopped responding to communications. She earned Fs in the 2 courses

In an effort to compromise, Logan is offering to withdraw Ms. Kostal from the two courses (MSN5020 and MSN 5100) without notation of pass or fail. This offered "W" has no effect on GPA and is generally only allowed within the first two weeks of a trimester. Should Ms. Kostal wish to re-enroll in the courses, she would follow the normal registration and tuition assessment process. Logan offers this compromise without admitting any liability.

Please tell us whether Ms. Kostal has accepted Logan's offer by Friday, May 10th. Otherwise the two Fs in MSN5020 and MSN 5100 will remain on her transcript.

Requested Corrective Actions

Dear Ms. McLaughlin:

As you know, I represent Brandi Kostal, a current student at Logan College of Chiropractic ("Logan").

Your May 7, 2013 letter confirms that Brandi was given failing grades in two masters level classes after accommodations were not made for her to make up work missed due to her pregnancy, delivery and post-delivery medical complications. The only solution to this situation that you propose is to remove the "F" grades and allow her to retake the classes next year if she pays again.

This is not acceptable.

Your May 7, 2013 letter did not address either Logan's violation of Title IX - the federal law that prohibits sex discrimination in education - or the almost identical situation which was recently resolved at the City University of New York ("CUNY") as identified in my May 6, 2013 letter. The email from Logan to Brandi flatly stating that pregnancy is not a recognized absence is exhibit 1 of Logan's violation of Title IX.

I had hoped to have a dialogue with Logan representatives in order to achieve a mutually beneficial resolution that restores Brandi to a position of being able to complete her education and allows Logan to avoid future violations of Title IX. Your May 7, 2013 letter, however, moves past a discussion of possible options and offers just one small concession.

Thus, in order to see if there is any opportunity for a consensual resolution, I must now outline Brandi's proposed resolution.

Brandi requests that Logan take the following actions:

- (1) remove the "F" grades on the two masters level courses:
- (2) allow her to resume the two masters level courses this term and complete them by July 31, 2013;
- (3) restore any grade deductions in other classes taken because of her pregnancy related absences;
 - (4) reimburse her costs incurred in resolving this situation;
- (5) adopt a new university wide policy addressing the rights of pregnant and parenting students under Title IX;
 - (6) conduct faculty training on Title IX; and
 - (7) include this new policy in the student handbook.

If Brandi's personal situation is to be solved this term, Logan must do items 1 · 3 above by May 17, 2013. The balance of the issues may be resolved in due course.

Since this is a matter for potential litigation, you must not destroy any documents relating to this subject matter including, but not limited to, documents relating to Brandi, Logan's policies regarding excused absences, Logan's files regarding any other current or former students who have had pregnancy related absences. This litigation hold must last until the later of entry of a final order closing any governmental investigation or public or private litigation or March 1, 2019 which is approximately 7 years after this situation first became known to Logan. Documents include paper documents and computer files.
